September 2012 - Series of Four Illustrated Talks

MulkearLIFE / Inland Fisheries Ireland today announce details of another block of free Illustrated Talks. These talks form part of the four year Environmental Education Programme of MulkearLIFE working with schools and in the local community throughout counties Limerick and Tipperary. The September 2012 series of talks will focus on Ireland’s rich natural heritage with a particular focus on the Lower Shannon Special Area of Conservation and the Mulkear catchment. The series will take place over four Tuesdays in September. The venue for all talks is the Inland Fisheries Ireland Office, Dock Road, Limerick, which is a 2-minute drive from Limerick City Centre, with ample free parking in front of the building. The first talk will take place on Tuesday 4th September. The speaker will be Mr. Glen Wightman entitled “MulkearLIFE’s Work with Sea Lamprey- A Success Story”. Mr. Wightman is the Project Officer with MulkearLIFE. His talk will cover the three species of lamprey in Irish water and their unique life history. The talk will primarily focus on Sea Lamprey migration in the Mulkear catchment and MulkearLIFE’s work to assist their migration. His talk should be of interest to all and especially to people wanting to learn more about these unique fish and those with an interest in the natural history of the Mulkear River.

“Future for Ireland’s Freshwater Fish on the Red Data List” is the title of the second talk on Tuesday 11th September with Dr. James King as guest speaker. Dr. King is a Fisheries Biologist with Inland Fisheries Ireland and is based in Swords, Co. Dublin. His talk will cover many of the “conservation fish species” listed in the Red Data List, including the shads, lampreys, smelt, char, pollan and Atlantic salmon. The talk should be of interest to all and especially to anglers and people interested fish conservation.

Dr. Alex Copland, Senior Conservation Officer with BirdWatch Ireland will guest speak on Tuesday 18th September and his illustrated talk is called “CAP Reform and Irish Farmland Birds – New Thinking”. Dr. Copland will speak about Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) reform and how the proposals could benefit not just birds, biodiversity and the environment but the people, both farmers and wider rural communities, on whom these species and habitats depend. His talk should be of particular interest to local farmers and conservationists.

The series of illustrated talks will conclude on Tuesday 25th September with a talk by Ms. Denise Delaney entitled “The OPW’s approach to Flood Risk Management and the Environment”. Ms. Delaney is an Engineer in the Environment Section of the Office of Public Works’ Flood Risk Management Service. Her talk will focus on the roles and responsibilities of the OPW in relation to Flood Risk Management, and the approach taken to ensure compliance with environmental legislation, with particular focus on the OPW’s Environmental River Enhancement Programme (EREP). The EREP is managed and co-ordinated jointly with Inland Fisheries Ireland, and involves the enhancement of selected salmonid channels across the OPW Arterial Drainage Schemes. Her talk should be of interest to all and especially to anglers and those with an interest in river enhancement”.
